Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

Central to our Catholic Identity is our faith formation. There are many spiritual activities throughout the liturgical year for staff and students to come together to celebrate our faith. There are staff and student liturgies, masses, confessions and formal sacramental preparation in Grades 2 & 7. The Grade 2 students will participate in a virtual church tour. The Grade 7 students will participate in a virtual church tour and retreat. Staff may also participate in board wide celebrations such as conferences and retreats. Staff and students participate in social justice initiatives, Community Response and contribute to campaigns such as ShareLife and Terry Fox.

Sacramental Preparation:

As Catholics, we understand sacraments to be "outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace." Together in partnership with our parish, we support the preparation of God's children in receiving the sacraments.

Social Justice / Outreach Activities / Charities:

Catholic Social Teachings of the Church root our actions in supporting human dignity and the preferential option of the poor which calls us to serve the most vulnerable in the world.

Our school community participates in food drives, a Christmas mitten tree, the coats for Kids program. We support our school community partnerships with St. Louise Outreach, Catholic Women's League, Knights of Columbus, and the Knight's Table. The students participate in the annual Terry Fox Run and we have regular actives to support ShareLife.

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

The OCSGE are embedded into daily school life. Students have the opportunity to be active members of the Eco Initiative, Faith Ambassadors, Health Diversity Team, and Social Justice Initiatives. All students have the opportunity to learn, practice their faith and to live the gospel values. Creating Pathways to Success support learners as they identify their strengths.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

We have monthly virtual Virtue assemblies. Each class is responsible for a presentation based on the Virtue of the Month. Morning prayers and announcements also help to highlight the Virtues and students are recognized for demonstrating the Virtues. A student in every classroom is recognized each month for demonstrating in both their words and actions the Virtue of the Month.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

In our front foyer we have a Commissioned Altar, cross, student-created Virtue crests and our Brampton West Religion banner. All classrooms have prayer tables with visible signs of faith. Morning prayer, school masses, retreats and liturgies all reflect the faith formation of students. Social outreach initiatives focus on serving the needs of others and being a warm welcoming school that provides pastoral care to the community.
